The importance of small groups

One of the most common and clearest signs of a healthy, high expectation church is the encouragement of members to move into small groups. The small group, such as a Bible study or discussion circle, connects people relationally, something that is difficult to achieve in a larger worship service. Once they build relationships in that small group, the likelihood of their departure drops significantly. In fact, those who are in a small group and attend the worship service are *five times* more likely to be active in church than those who attended worship services alone.
