On Saturday 7 April there will be a parish **discernment day at the Richmond Parish Centre**, 10 - 3. The leader will be the amazing **Shawn Branch**, formerly the head of Threshold Ministries. This will be an important opportunity to consider what it is to become more mission-focused. The event will include a **combined parish service** at St John's on Sunday 8 April, our first parish service in years. Mr Branch will preach.

**Operation Christmas Child** reminds us that the post-Valentine season is a good time to be taking advantage of sales of stuffed animals etc that will come in handy at year's end.

**BISHOP EDWARDS' PILGRIMAGE** through the Woodstock archdeaconry begins **Wednesday 23 May** with a quiet service of Evening Prayer at St Luke's Woodstock. During his ensuing fortnight among us the Bishop will hold services - morning, noon or evening - in every Anglican house of worship from Temperance

Vale to Edmundston (which is a great many), plus **Camp Brookwood**. He and his aide-de-camp will sleep in a dozen of these churches. He will also follow the Malecite Trail to Hay's Falls, enjoy spring flowers in Ronald Bell's woods, walk the Longest Covered Bridge (twice), pack potatoes and perhaps tour a well-known French fry factory.
