She said that after hearing Bishop David Edwards' New Year's Day sermon at the Cathedral, "I decided to switch things up. I took that nudge to heart." That nudge was to volunteer at Bishop's Court, Fredericton's Out of the Cold Shelter.

"It's quite surreal to walk into a place that used to be your own home that's now a homeless shelter," she said.

After a few turns helping guests settle in, "I realized I live in a bubble," she said. "The last time I was on snack duty, and that's where you really get to know them. " One guy said, 'this is a lovely home. I hope I can have a home like this someday.' How gracious. He didn't say 'well, this is how the other half lives, huh?'"
