This event will be by invitation only and hosted by Rev. **Chris Ketch**. A COVID operational plan has been developed and will be updated as Public Health guidelines continue to evolve over the next few weeks.

Next Friday/Saturday Archbishop Edwards presides over the **synod of the Ecclesiastical Province of Canada**, to be held via

Zoom. (Here, "Canada" means all the dioceses in Quebec, NB, NS/PEI and Nfld.) At least one of our own parishioners is a Synod member.

Among sad events of recent days is the death from Covid of an important servant in urban aboriginal ministry, **Margaret Seegers**: https://www.vancouver.anglican.ca/news/the-reverend-vivian-margaret-seegers-priest At the end of the obituary is a reference to her pursuit of what is called the *via media*. Usually that concept imagines Anglicanism as a middle way (*via media*) between Roman Catholicism and Reformed Christianity (Protestantism). But for Native Anglicans in Canada, the *via media* is the combining of Anglican spirituality with the insights of traditional aboriginal spirituality. Recently some of us had a challenging encounter with this, courtesy of the remarkable Archbishop Mark MacDonald. It's a striking idea.
