This Sunday Morning Prayer at St John's will feature a dramatic narration of the **passion story according to Mark's gospel**.

On Monday **Bishop Hockin** delivered the third of Bill Hockin Ministries' Lenten 2021 talks, which is now released on the internet. Eventually these talks generate an audience far larger than the hotel ballroom crowd of the "old" days.

During one of last year's shutdowns, a **Woodstock Baptist** mentioned that her cable subscription brought a weekly Anglican service from St Andrews -- broadcast on Charlotte County Community Television -- and that she was appreciating it. It turns out she was not alone. March's **NB Anglican** explains the surprising route by which the St Andrews service has come to be **broadcast all across Canada**. It also makes the point that these popular Morning Prayer services don't just happen. They adhere to high production values and take hard work. All of our liturgical leadings and followings need to involve high production values.

What the story does not mention is that the parish of St Andrews has received a \$10,000+ **grant from the Synod** to further its broadcasting efforts. Twice a year the Synod makes a call for special grant applications, open to every parish.

The same St Andrews story explains **how the parish uses Zoom** for Thursday morning “**coffee hour**” devotionals led by laity, for **Bible discussions** and even for **craft classes**. It notes that Zoom participants can tune in from literally anywhere.

Also in the news is our own **Nancy Robinson**. Nancy has just released **Seekers of the Heart**, a sequel to **Hearts of Glass** (2015). A romantic Christian novel, **Seekers** reconnects the reader with many characters of the earlier book and introduces new ones, challenging their faith, and offering second chances at life and love. Nancy is the spouse of **Rick Robinson**, who has just marked the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of ordination as a priest.

**Fresh flowers for Easter.** Cut forsythia shoots. Choose the ones with lots of buds. Immerse over night. Put in vase in warm location (but not direct sunlight). Change water every 4<sup>th</sup> day (a dash of plant food each time will yield bigger blossoms). If you do this **today**, you should have golden boughs for Easter.
