A summary of **Richmond parish financials** to the end of August is *attached to this email*.

Thanks to our **Compassion Fund** for issuing the **school backpack** challenge and to parishioners for responding with items and funds. *Attached to this email* is a photo of one of the collections.

The parish is asked to pivot from the backpack challenge to another. **Love Atlantic** is appealing to each congregation in the Atlantic provinces to undertake **some activity of "radical generosity in Jesus' name"** in its neighbourhood during the week of **2 to 8 October**. According to **Shawn Branch**, "We have one parish collecting toiletries for a women's shelter in their community". "One is holding a barbecue for the school adjacent to them. Another is talking about doing a grounds clean-up at a local nursing home." **What might each congregation here do to show love for and in its neighbourhood?**

Last Sunday St Mark's held its 2022 **Memorial service** (the first was in 1932). **Sandra Black** preached on "fortitude and faith". In the front seat of the congregation both fortitude and faith were embodied in the person of a 97-year-old parishioner who had but recently broken a hip. Her example was a sermon in itself.

**St George's church**, Bairdsville, is probably the oldest church building in the upper St John valley. This coming Sunday, Archbishop Edwards preaches at its **175<sup>th</sup> anniversary**, 10:30 am.
