Please continue to **remember the Food Bank** when you shop. Particularly needed are canned tomatoes, vegetables and soups, and tuna, ham etc suitable for children's lunches.

Covid – Rules have been tightened a bit. All people attending public worship are to remain masked (infants excepted) and distanced. There is to be no singing (except a soloist). Experts

now recommend strongly that people use only K95 or **KN95 masks** (not cloth masks). Attenders at **St Mark's** and **Holy Trinity** must be double vaccinated (children under 12 excepted), though not at **St John's**.

In navigating covid, please remember that **nothing should be done on behalf of the parish that puts others at significant risk**. This includes in-person visiting, sharing and all forms of singing during services. People should take care to sit distinctly away from others who are not in their bubble.
