*During Lent* the e-News is offering meditative musical suggestions.

People who listened to evening concerts on CBC radio in the 1970s and 1980s may remember that among those often acknowledged at a program's close was **Srul Irving Glick**. When not earning his living at the CBC, Glick (1934-2002) was composing a wide range of choral, orchestral and Jewish liturgical music that was then unfashionably tuneful. One major composition was a choral symphony. Its final section, **The Hour has Come**, has become popular with good choirs, always the *final* piece on their program (listening, you will hear why). It is offered here as a meditation for both this **Saturday's Earth Hour** and the **folly of war**.

"The hour has come for mankind to embrace, for the sun blazes upon the conscience of the earth and time is growing short. And what is visible must be seen. For the fire is intense in the consciousness of the planet, and healing is the yearning of her heart. Our cells are life's tissue, our bones and marrow her rivers and narrows. Our heart pumps the cry of her heart."
