Tomorrow (Friday 16 February) is the appointed day for **fasting**, **prayer** and humiliation for the crises in Israel/Gaza and Ukraine. The Primate that the Lutheran National Bishop write: The practice of fasting is a concrete way to focus our hearts and minds by letting go of something we enjoy or expect. We then use that time and mental space to pray throughout the day. You may choose to fast from food or from social media, computer time, music, television or whatever is appropriate for you. During the day, whenever your heart remembers

or at times you designate, you stop and cry from your heart to God about the situations in Israel/Palestine/Gaza and Ukraine.

Update from the Food Bank Back in January 2023, Volunteer Family Services (aka the Food Bank) was feeding 650 people (one-third of them children). **This January it fed 782**. The Food Bank is always in need of soups, non-sugary cereal, canned beans, canned pasta, dry pasta, tuna/hamburger helper, vegetables (fresh, frozen, canned), oatmeal, pancake mix, tea, shampoo (men & women), deodorant (men & women), razers (men & women), toothbrushes.

The **Compassion Fund** continues active and it's time for us to consider adding a Compassion Fund donation to weekly offerings. Since September the Fund **has provided assistance in the amount of \$1,200**. This includes a Sobeys gift card and monetary assistance for a person living alone and recovering from surgery; a Sobeys gift card for a mother with young children at Christmas; a Christmas donation and personal hygiene items (much appreciated) for Sanctuary House; and a donation and Superstore gift card for a family in need.
