Food Bank: **Let's fill those boxes** and show gratitude to God by sharing with our neighbour the blessings we have been given.



THE HOLY GOSPEL OF OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST ACCORDING TO MARK

- They came to Jericho.
- As Jesus and his disciples and a large crowd were leaving Jericho, Bartimaeus son of Timaeus, a blind beggar, was sitting by the roadside.
- When he heard that it was Jesus of Nazareth, he began to shout out and say, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me!"

A READING FROM THE BOOK OF JOB

- Then Job answered the Lord: "I know that you can do all things, and that no purpose of yours can be thwarted.
- 'Who is this that hides counsel without knowledge?'
- Therefore I have uttered what I did not understand, things too wonderful for me, which I did not know.
- 'Hear, and I will speak; I will question you, and you declare to me.'
- I had heard of you by the hearing of the ear, but now my eye sees you; therefore I despise myself, and repent in dust and ashes."
- And the Lord restored the fortunes of Job when he had prayed for his friends; and the Lord gave Job twice as much as he had before.
- Then there came to him all his brothers and sisters and all
 who had known him before, and they ate bread with him in
 his house; they showed him sympathy and comforted him for
 all the evil that the Lord had brought upon him; and each of
 them gave him a piece of money and a gold ring.
- The Lord blessed the latter days of Job more than his beginning; and he had fourteen thousand sheep, six thousand camels, a thousand yoke of oxen, and a thousand donkeys.
- He also had seven sons and three daughters.
- He named the first Jemimah, the second Keziah, and the third Keren happuch.
- In all the land there were no women so beautiful as Job's daughters; and their father gave them an inheritance along with their brothers.
- After this Job lived one hundred and forty years, and saw his children, and his children's children, four generations.
- And Job died, old and full of days.

A READING FROM THE LETTER TO THE HEBREWS

- Furthermore, the former priests were many in number, because they were prevented by death from continuing in office; but he holds his priesthood permanently, because he continues forever
- Consequently he is able for all time to save those who approach God through him, since he always lives to make intercession for them.
- For it was fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, blameless, undefiled, separated from sinners, and exalted above the heavens.
- Unlike the other high priests, he has no need to offer sacrifices day after day, first for his own sins, and then for those of the people; this he did once for all when he offered himself.
- For the law appoints as high priests those who are subject to weakness, but the word of the oath, which came later than the law, appoints a Son who has been made perfect forever.
