The theme of the next **Talking Tuesday** discussion (12 November) will be **Prayers God Always Says Yes to**: 2:00 PM at the Parish Centre and 7:00 PM at St. Luke's.

Last week's **Diocesan Synod** began with a remembrance of frequent Synod attenders from the past. Among them was our own **Wendell Parkinson**. Highlight of the day was reports on various forms of community outreach, presented from all parts of the province. Some poor congregations in forgotten places are doing amazing work, which begins with thinking hard about what the neighbourhood around actually needs.

Where the Saints Have Trod With sufficient interest the rector is willing to lead a **pilgrimage to Ireland** next September. Attend an information session the first of which is next Wednesday (13 November) 7:00 PM at the Rectory and on Zoom.

Operation Christmas Child: The blessing of the Christmas shoeboxes takes place on Sunday 17 November; filling the familiar with small items useful or interesting to a girl, boy or either.

This year's **advent group study** in the Rich/Wood parishes takes the form of a virtual journey to Bethlehem. It begins Monday 25 November at St. Luke's, 7:00 PM and continues weekly both on both Monday afternoons (Richmond) and Tuesday evenings (St. Luke's).

The Synod Office is organizing an overnight **Advent retreat**. It will be held in Rothesay Friday/Saturday 13-14 December. Leader will be the gifted Bishop Sandra Fyfe of Nova Scotia/PEI. Register online at https://nb.anglican.ca/events.

A READING FROM THE FIRST BOOK OF PETER

- 3. By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead
- 4. and into an inheritance that is imperishable, undefiled, and unfading, kept in heaven for you,
- 5. who are being protected by the power of God through faith for a salvation ready to be revealed in the last time.
