When Bonhoeffer writes "The Cost of Discipleship" in 1937, he makes distinctions between grace that is cheap and grace that is costly. Cheap grace demands that God "forgive us our sins," without any reciprocal demands that we forgive those who sin against us. Costly grace, on the other hand yokes us-aligns us, calls us, marries us-to **the costly way of Christ**. How are we to understand the way of Christ? Bonhoeffer puts it starkly: "When Christ calls a man, he bids him come and die."
