Again this year the **flowers outside St Luke's** are eye-catching and a great asset to Woodstock's Main Street. What if every business and church followed this example?

General Synod convenes officially on Tuesday and runs to a big concluding day next Sunday; committee work begins Monday. The prolocutor calls the Synod a meeting of Jesus's disciples. Think of that. The 7-person diocese of Fredericton delegation has met in person already to talk things over. The primatal choice begins to weigh heavily.

There is good news. This Sunday, just before he leaves for General Synod, Archbishop Edwards will lead morning service at Christ Church (Lower Woodstock) to mark the 220th anniversary of start of construction of the first Christ Church, then the **only house of worship above Fredericton**. Progress on completing the edifice was slow, as apparently people in those days were quite tiny. On 24 June 1813 Parson Dibblee writes:

The carpenters are now finishing the pews of the church, & when they are finished the remaining purchase money will be due. It is supposed that after all expenses are settled there will be sufficient for a handsome railed fence round the whole yard & church. When that is completed there will be an excellent, decent church 60 miles from Fredericton capable of accommodating **300 persons**, where 26 years since was an entire wilderness.

At last Sunday's service at St Mark's the **Sunday School kids** presented everyone with a gorgeous hand-painted tile. Two examples are with this week's e-News but each was unique. People were impressed and grateful.
