Donations will be directed to the parish's Operating fund unless the donor directs otherwise. Eligible donations generate a tax receipt early in the new year.

The McCain Gallery (Florenceville) has launched its 2025 **Small Works exhibition**, running to 20 December. Fine art and quality crafts will be on sale and display, including from parish artists. Always worth viewing or showing to a visiting friend.

Last week's Vestry meeting set the price of burial rights in Richmond's **cemetery single lots** as \$600. This is the same as Christ Church cemetery, but only two-thirds of the price in Woodstock's two cemeteries.

There is good news. Last Sunday brought quite a surprise at St Mark's. Electricity finally reached that neighbourhood in the 1950s, and at some later point **Gerald Briggs** (1924-2021) of Maine donated hanging lanterns of milk-white glass and Art Deco gold scrolling in honour of his parents. Later, however, the wire crossing the road to bring electricity to the church was snagged by a passing pulp truck. This tugged the wire so

sharply that two of those lanterns hanging in the church smashed to the floor. Something prompted a member of the congregation to salvage some of that shattered glass. Recently – decades later — that congregant had bits of the white/gold glass embedded into the centre of locally-created stained-glass crosses. Last Sunday **Marilyn Wilson** presented these crosses featuring such historic glass to each of the households in St Mark's congregation. See attached photos.
