Knitting for Victory: Remembrance and Recognition is the name of a travelling exhibit that opened Tuesday at Woodstock's Connell House. "This wonderful exhibit recognizes the achievements of Canadian women who knit garments for the comfort of those serving in the Second World War". Among thousands of knitters for the troops and stitchers for the English children evacuated to Canada was our own Viola Bell. Her diary details the busy efforts of Oakville's Anglican guild, United Church Ladies Aid and Red Cross (Viola belonged to everything) to sew and knit for those in wartime need. As she writes after a St Mark's Guild meeting on 4 July 1940: "Some taking knitting & sewing home. I brought 3 skeins of yarn to wash & a kiddie's pyjama suit to make."
