There is good news. Once upon a time – it was in August 2024 – we arrived at Holy Trinity on Sunday morning to find a bicycle propped neatly against this building. Perhaps this was a cross-Canada cyclist arriving for morning service before setting off for another day. But no – it was a mystery. Ken Tompkins continues the story: We brought it into the church to keep it safe, and I advertised in the community asking if anyone was missing a bicycle. I received no response and the bicycle was kept at the church for the past year. Last Friday I went to Holy Trinity to collect the brush and weeds that Marilyn Wilson had pruned from around the church. A young lad (Brayden) from the apartment across the street from Holy Trinity came over and asked if he could give me a hand because it had started raining. I was very thankful for the help. After we bagged the brush I asked him if he had a bicycle. He did, but his older brother didn't have one. So I offered him the bicycle and told him he could keep it

himself or give it to his brother. I also went across the street and spoke with his father to let him know the story of the bicycle. Since the day Brayden received the bicycle he's been riding it around the neighbourhood, and just a few minutes ago we met up and he thanked me again for it. He does very much appreciate it.

This week's e-News shares Holy Trinity's ex-mystery bicycle (now Brayden's), a glimpse of late-summer sun streaming through the McBride memorial window and striking the altar at last evening's crowded harvest songs of praise service at St Mark's, and some of the attenders at last Thursday's Do Drop Inn gathering at the Parish Centre (missing are the wonderful blueberry tarts on offer).
