Thanksgiving Sunday will be marked by a parish communion service at **St John's**, with new technology, 9 am. Beginning at 8 a **light breakfast** will be on offer (fruit, croissants, pancakes, muffins, etc). Invite a friend.

Archbishop Edwards has announced that our rector soon will take up the additional role of **territorial archdeacon of Woodstock**. "Woodstock", in this sense, is a jurisdiction extending from Canterbury to Edmundston. Archdeacons – usually clerics, sometimes lay administrators – are consulted by local clergy and church wardens on the sort of question that need not go to the bishop. Archdeacons are expected to be informed of and give their consent to applications for significant changes to the structure or use of church-owned buildings. They have a particular role in staying in touch with vacant parishes.

With the appointment of an archdeacon for Woodstock, **Shawn Branch**'s role as episcopal legate to the Upper St John valley comes to an end. We were always glad to have Shawn among us. His busy duties have shifted to other corners of the diocese.
